### My business holidays



It will stay open for three months. When the spring arrives, it will melt. Then it will be built again for next year - maybe in a different place! Each room is supplied with a sleeping bag made from deer skins. The hotel has two art galleries featuring ice sculptures, and an ice cinema. It also has a bar where all the drinks come in glasses made of ice. Of course I'll visit them all!

In complete contrast to the Ice Hotel, I'm going to Dubai the following month, to stay a few days at the spectacular Burj al-Arab, which means the Arabian Tower. It's shaped like a giant sail, and it rises dramatically out of the Arabian Gulf. Each room has sea views.

I really want to try the restaurant in the tube at the top next to the helipad. Other must-dos include shopping in the markets, called souks. (You can buy designer clothes, perfumes, and spices, but what I want is some gold jewellery.) I'm also going to visit the camel races. The next trip, different again, is to Baobab Rivers, in Selous, Tanzania, for a seven-day safari
